Centre for Bioactive Discovery in Health and Ageing

The Centre is a multidisciplinary research group within the School of Biological, Biomedical & Molecular Sciences at the University of New England, Armidale. Research activities include hormonal regulation of pregnancy and ovulation and the role of leptin in foetal development. Research on the biology of ageing includes studies on the role of free radicals and antioxidants in altering the synthesis of stress proteins. The isolation and identification of bioactive compounds from native Australian plants includes studies on compounds exhibiting anti-bacterial, anti-fungal and anti-viral activities. Research is also concentrated on modulation of the immune response by antioxidants and herbal extracts.

The focus of the Research Centre in Molecular Microbiology is the use of molecular biology to study micro-organisms of importance to human health, agriculture or industry. Organisms under study include nitrogen fixing and thermophilic soil bacteria, the anaerobic bacterium which causes footrot, and the fungi *Aspergillus nidulans*, *Aspergillus fumigatus* and *heliaviopsis basicola*, which causes black root rot in cotton.
